Call for application for the recruitment of one PhD student

As part of a project entitled: **Strengthening local capacity for malaria surveillance and elimination in Africa** awarded to the Pan-African Mosquitoes Control Association (PAMCA) by the Bill and Melinda Foundation and led in Cameroon by the Centre for Research in Infectious Diseases (CRID), we are launching a call for application addressed to young students, residing in Cameroon, for **one PhD project**.

The successful applicant will be working on a 3-year project focused on the development of new tools for next-generation malaria surveillance by exploring the modulation of salivary gland proteins expression by Plasmodium parasites. This will involve various aspects such as mosquito biology, experimental infections, transcriptomics and proteomics analyses using RNA sequencing, iTRAQ technology, SDS-PAGE and western blot analyses.

REQUIREMENTS

- The applicant must have completed a Master's degree in the past 3 years in Biochemistry, Microbiology, Biology or any other biomedical field.
- He/she must demonstrate competences in either molecular biology, biochemistry, entomology, epidemiology and statistics. Skills on proteomic analysis techniques such as appreciable level in oral and written English would be valuable.
- The candidate will be fully involved in study design, field expedition, laboratory work and any other task associated to the project.
- He/she must be able to critically analyze his project, integrate, collaborate and interact with a multi-disciplinary research team.
- The project will be carried out in the CRID laboratory in Yaoundé.

- Updated detailed curriculum vitae;
- A letter of motivation;
- Academic transcripts;
- A support letter from previous supervisor.
