Working in close collaboration with multidisciplinary teams and policy stakeholders, the Health Economist will ensure that economic analyses effectively inform decision-making processes for national programmes, donors, and global health partners. This role underscores CRID's commitment to advancing informed, data-driven strategies that promote efficient and sustainable health solutions.</p>

Main Duties & Responsibilities	
	Design and implement household-level economic studies to capture malaria's economic burden.
	Conduct local costing and cost-effectiveness analyses comparing SRs with dual-active LLINs.
	Develop and apply health economic models (cost-effectiveness, cost-benefit, ROI).
	Use appropriate costing and cost effectiveness methods to collect, validate, and analyze cost and resource-use data using standardized methods.
	Integrate economic evidence with epidemiological and entomological outputs (including the MINT webtool).

Conduct affordability and budget impact analyses to inform NMCPs and donor strategies.
Provide policy recommendations for malaria control stakeholders based on health economic findings.
Produce high-quality outputs including reports, policy briefs, and peer-reviewed publications in health economics.
Ensure analyses consider equity, accessibility, efficiency and affordability for vulnerable populations.
Engage NMCPs, Ministries of Health, MINFI, MINEPAT, WHO, donors, and product developers to translate evidence into policy and investment decisions.
Mentor junior researchers and support local capacity-building in applied health economics.
Apply methodological innovations to strengthen the robustness of health economic evaluations.
